## Paper Writing Workshop, March 16 – 27, 2009

## **Objective:**

In this workshop we aim at discussing and reviewing paper manuscripts of the participants to improve them for publication.

## Before the workshop:

All participants have to hand in a paper draft (in English of German) until February 16th. This paper draft must not be longer than 20 pages but must have an abstract with the central statement of the paper, introduction, theorie/background part, data & methods, results, and conclusion. The targeted journal or other place of publication should be indicated. We will distinguish into groups in respect to the paper topics. Ideal group size is four people. Participation without a complete paper draft is not possible.

We will provide literature on paper writing beforehand, which is the base for the discussion of our review standards on Monday. Afterwards, these review standards will serve the discussion of each individual paper. We will furthermore distribute a paper draft for practising a review process on Monday afternoon.
