CO-FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

You are eligible for a co-funding award if:

• You are a non-German alumna/alumnus of a German university. That means you have studied, worked and/or carried out research for at least three months at a German university. • Or you are a (non-German) holder of a sur-place scholarship from a German institution. That means you have received a scholarship provided by a German organisation for studying at a university or other institution of higher education in your home country or in a third country.

The co-funding award covers part of your travel costs and a daily allowance. On top of that, places for self-payment are reserved for persons who do not fulfill the criteria stated above. This means, you can participate, even if you are not eligible for co-funding. In that case, you or your organisation will cover all occurring costs.

Fee per course: € 620

All courses are accompanied by a framework programme that allows participants to become familiar with current scholarly discussions in course-relevant areas of development cooperation, and to meet representatives of German governmental and non-governmental organisations active in this field.
