

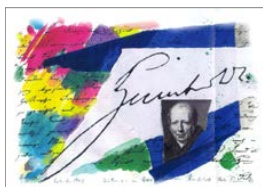
There are many reasons to study Agricultural Economics in Berlin

The Master of Science Program

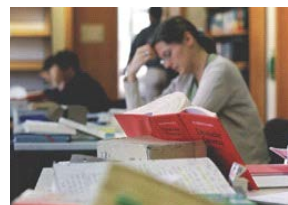
The Faculty of Agriculture and Horticulture's academic programs set international standards. They facilitate and encourage study abroad program periods through cooperation with a large number of international universities.

Many courses are taught in English. A high portion of international students show the attractive global orientation of the M.Sc. program at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin.

For bachelor graduates in agricultural, environmental, or economic sciences, the M.Sc. program in Agricultural Economics offers outstanding chances to become competitive in the international labour market.

The program integrates economics and agricultural sciences. The core courses include Institutional Economics and Political Economy, Market and Policy Analysis, Microeconomics and Econometrics as well as Quantitative Decision Models in Agribusiness.

Possible elective courses are Agricultural Management, Agricultural Policy, International Agricultural Development or Environmental and Resource Economics.



Student research projects analyse problems of agriculture and the food sector. A broad range of optional courses can be chosen from, including courses from other academic units. Our graduates find employment in a variety of areas such as in agribusiness, insurance, banking and finance sector, national and international organizations (EU, FAO, OECD), and in agricultural R & D.
